






GEN Z - CONSUMERS


- Gen Z consumers are mostly well-educated about brands and the realities behind them. When they are not, they know how to access information and develop a point of view quickly.
- 70 percent of respondents say they try to purchase products from companies they consider ethical.
- 80 percent say they remember at least one scandal or controversy involving a company.
- **65 percent** try to learn the origins of anything they buy:
 - where it is made,
 - what it is made from, and
 - how it is made. About 80 percent refuse to buy goods from companies involved in scandals.


THE LEGAL LANDSCAPE

In addition to the **German Supply Chain Act (LkSG)** introduced on 1 January 2023, the provisional political agreement on the **EU Corporate Sustainability Due Diligence Directive (CSDDD)** aims to hold organizations accountable for their impact on the environment and human rights abuses and to identify, prevent, and mitigate potential adverse impacts associated with their operations and supply chains.

Key Components are:

- ✓ Due Diligence Obligations
- Transparent Sustainability Reporting
- ✓ Enforcement: Administrative and Civil Liability





THE LEGAL LANDSCAPE

In addition to the mandatory legislative frameworks, it should be emphasized that the OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises and the UN Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights can provide a significant context for **meeting the legal requirements**.

As a Social Certification Scheme, FSSC 24000 provides a **robust framework of requirements** that are reflected in these guidelines and can be helpful in the development and implementation of human rights due diligence processes and supply chain management.

DUE DILIGENCE PROCESS

Social Procurement and Human Rights Due Diligence requires **continuous monitoring** of the processes that represent a significant core element of the Social Management System.

The systematic implementation of defined steps requires a **risk-based approach** and spans across all areas within the social management system.

To ensure that socially responsible practices throughout the entire supply chain, which includes but is not limited to raw materials, ingredients, products, packaging, materials, or services relevant to the Social Management System, are controlled and continuously monitored, the organization should implement a **Plan-Do-Check-Act (PDCA) cycle** within their procurement process.






PROCESS APPROACH

The implementation of a social management system is key to ensuring a robust human rights due diligence process.

It addresses potential adverse impacts or social risks that may arise within the organization and its linked processes or services.









IMPLEMENTATION

- Communicate the FSSC 24000 requirements.
- Implement and incorporate robust and 2 responsible business conduct into social management policies and procedures.
- Assessment of adverse social impacts and prioritizing by the risk/severity and the likelihood of occurrence.
- Integrate and act on the Findings
- Monitoring the effectiveness of the implementation and results.
- Communicate (report) and remediate

AUDITING

The organization must ensure that its providers meet the requirements set out in the Scheme through a due diligence process.

Auditors **should examine** the approach an organization has taken to:

- Assess, based on risk classification, the adverse impact of its providers;
- 2 Act on the identified findings of the impact assessment;
- Monitor the implementation of actions defined to mitigate the adverse impacts;
- 4 Remediate and communicate about how impacts are addressed.



The auditor should bear in mind that the organization should determine the extent of the documented information that is deemed necessary.





HOW TO OBTAIN CERTIFICATION



Obtain the FSSC 24000 documents.

Scheme document & PAS 24000 are available for free on the FSSC website.



Conduct an internal audit against requirements of FSSC 24000.

Guidance Documents can be downloaded from the FSSC website.



Action and implement any identified issues/shortcomings.



Contact an FSSC 24000 licensed CB to arrange an audit.

The FSSC website contains a list of licensed CBs.



Conduct the initial or transition audit.


Refer to the 3-year Certification Cycle.
