
















SOCIAL RISKS: CONDITIONS OF WORK

SUPPLY CHAIN RISKS: HUMAN RIGHTS



WHAT ARE FSSC 24000 OPPORTUNITIES?

SOCIAL COMPLIANCE DRIVERS



There is an increasing external pressure to govern social aspects and ensure good practices properly:

- Society at large is less and less tolerant of abuses, corruption cases, bad work conditions, etc.
- Legislators follow societal pressures via political parties to respond to new ethical requirements.
- Peers can use good practices as differentiating factors.
- NGOs and activist investors add to social pressure.



EVOLUTION OF REGULATORY CONTEXT

- The responsibility of enterprises is extended down to the customers/ end users and out to all suppliers.
- Over the last few years, legislation has incorporated concepts and principles of "universality".
- Areas involved include bribery and corruption, money laundering and terrorism financing, human rights across the supply chain, and compliance with economic and trade sanctions.

ESG Due Diligence (active from 2017)





- Being FSSC 24000 certified will satisfy the requirements of the Canadian Law S-211 and the European Union, both CSRD and CSDDD.
- Future laws worldwide will mimic these; some are already at work. All are based on the ISO approach.



OTHER OPPORTUNITIES

FSSC 24000 can be complemented with other good practices, which you can use as a differentiating factor from your competition.

- Participation in the United Nations Global Compact
- Declaration of alignment with UN Sustainable Development Goals on your CSRD report
- Deployment of a full Responsible Sourcing process
- Review the Sustainability of the Production
- Review the Sustainability and availability of your Supply Chain

Some companies produce «greenwashing» and unsubstantial activities or certifications. Similar practices are also used in social compliance (social washing?).

Publicize on prof. social media and non-prof. media on the risks of ungoverned social risks and the potential solutions

Legislators

Participate in discussions with Governments & International Organizations about social issues.

Propose PAS 24000 as a local standard.




