







Context on public-private partnership

- Limited public funding for inspection triggered the necessity for publicprivate partnership, first piloted in the United Kingdom
- Adoption of the Principles and Guidelines for the Assessment and Use of voluntary Third-Party Assurance (vTPA) Programmes (CXG 93-2021)
- UNIDO's engagement with private sector, including food safety service providers



UNIDO voluntary Third-Party Assurance project in West Africa (Mali and Senegal)

- Objective: Use of voluntary standards for data-driven regulatory decision-making through a partnership approach
- Outcome: optimizing public resources by focusing higher risk sectors
- Possible upscaling in the ECOWAS region









Tools developed for the vTPA

vTPA Readiness Check




vTPA Assessment Tool

Pilot of the vTPA Assessment Tool

- Guided training programme for regulators on the process and principles how to assess a vTPA programme
- Follows a methodology based on the Codex Guidelines criteria
- Piloted in Egypt in January 2023 in collaboration with the UK FSA








vTPA Partnership Platform

A vTPA partnership platform has been established by UNIDO to mobilize expertise and resources under the West Africa and the Central America vTPA projects.

Purpose: improve current SPS practices and the capacities of relevant stakeholders. This, in turn, improves the quality and delivery mechanism of the vTPA programs in the pilot countries.



The platform currently

has 19 members

meets 3 times/year

Since October 2022, members have met six times, five of them virtually and one in person, as part of the activities of the Vienna Food Safety Forum.
















